Dear Patron,

June is finally here! And June means town meeting time for the town of Rangeley. As you may remember from last year, our town budget is now voted on at the polls instead of at town meeting. This means that all "donation requests" have only one chance of passage, without the ability to amend a request. Either a non-profit like the library gets the entire amount it has requested from the town, or it gets nothing. As you can imagine, getting no funding from the town of Rangeley would be devastating to our budget. Therefore, it is very important that library supporters turn out to support the library. We have requested \$43,029 from Rangeley, which is exactly the same amount we have requested for the past five years.

Last year there was some confusion at the polls because Rangeley Public Library was included under a line item known as "culture" but not listed separately. This year, the library has been returned to its own line item in the "donation" category. As an organization we work hard to provide the town with quality library services, and our board of directors takes its role of fundraising very seriously, succeeding in raising more than half of our annual budget. Please help us raise the remainder through your vote on June 12th.
