First Indian

Ed Rice, author of *Baseball's First Indian: The Story of Penobscot Legend Louis Sockalexis*, will be at the Rangeley Public Library to discuss the first-known Native American to play professional baseball. Born in 1871 on Maine's Penobscot Indian Reservation, Sockalexis inspired the name of Cleveland's baseball team. Rice is working to help build a

statue in honor of Sockalexis in the state of Maine.

Weds. Sept. 25, 6:00 PM**






